How to **MEASURE** your pet **CORRECTLY**

You are now one step closer getting to know us!

You have downloaded our eBook to help measure your dog to suit one of our amazing pet doors. Using this guide, we will help demonstrate how to measure your dog correctly to determine the size of the pet door you require, as we have an extensive range this can be overwhelming.

Prior to using this guide, we recommend you measure your dog when it is at least 16 weeks old (preferably 6 months old) due to the high-end

cross breeding that is available these days, for example a Cockapoo (Cocker Spaniel x Poodle) may outgrow its potential development as they can be unpredictably taller or short than originally planned.



However, there are dog breeds (Terroirs, German Shepard's etc) which you know they are going to grow to a certain height and can be certain of their size. If you do require any assistance, make sure you speak to one of our friendly staff members and they will be able to guide you through this process.

An alternative way to measure your fully-grown pet that we also recommend, using the pet door measurements provided to you on the following page, obtain a large section of cardboard and create a template and help guide your dog through the door. If he or she does not fit through that door please contact our office and we will create a custom dog door for you, no door is too big!

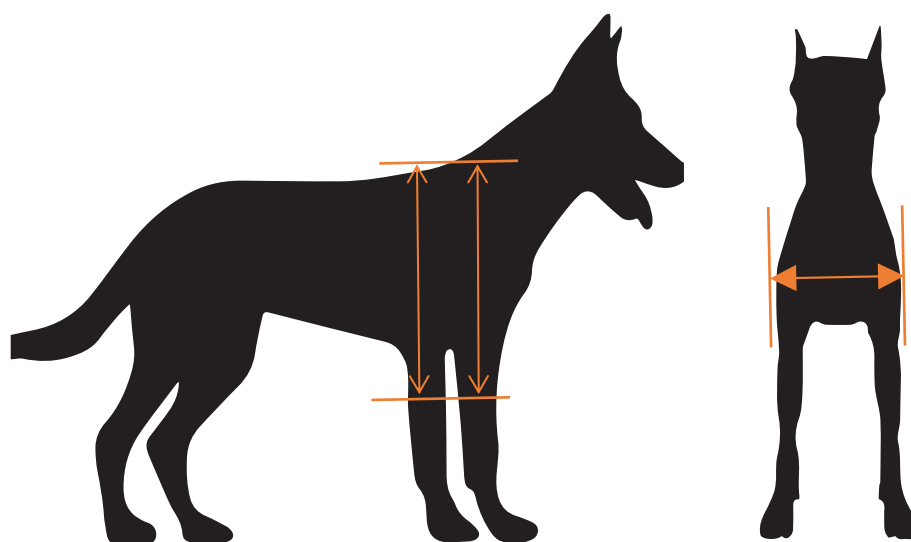
Measuring Your Pet

How to measure your pet correctly

Ensure you measure your pet correctly as you do not want to purchase a door that is too big or too small. If the door is too big and you have a small pet, your pet may not be able to use that door as they do not have the strength to open it.

Obviously, if the door is too small, your pet will not be able to glide through the door with ease.

Have your pet stand up straight & measure as per the diagrams below:



*Please note: Pet doors will not be installed to the bottom of the glass window or door unless your pet is a very small/short legged pet. Peel Pet Access Doors will install the door at a minimum 50mm from the bottom of the frame or higher for larger pets.



Pet Door Sizing

How to measure your pet correctly

Using the sizes below with determine which door your pet requires.

If you pet measurements do not fit within these sizes, please contact Peel Pet Access Doors as they will provide a custom pet door for you.

Flap Sizing	Cut Out Size	Width	Height	Pet Weight
