







Evaluate the Window Glass If the window doesn't fall or it's just partially broken, you might need to take a closer look to assess it.

The sensitive cracks can make the entire window fall at a given time. Look if the glass is unstable and if the frame and the pane are still intact.





Ensure Window Safety

Do not take emergent action but secure the window slowly and surely. If the glass repair company is not available at the moment, what you need to do is to minimize the threat of falling window glass.

Use gloves to remove the large shards of glass from the window frame. If the glass has fallen out completely from the frame, it is better to cover the window with something that could protect your home from the glass pieces that may snap off.

For this, you can use plywood or a heavy tarpaulin. Another scenario is if the glass doesn't fall out of the window but it has a long series of cracks that can collapse whenever. Using duct tape or any other tape that is strong enough, tape the cracks to seal it temporarily.

Cleaning the Glass

After picking the loose glass and shards, put them in a bag and throw them in the bin immediately.

If the broken window falls around hardwood floors and tiles, sweep them carefully before you use the vacuum cleaner.

This protects the floor from scratch and ensures a good clean-up.
